Ticks generally live in wooded area, grass, bushes, undergrowth, and clearings, but can also be found anywhere there is grass. Ticks are unable to jump so rely on animals and people to brush past so they can attach and feed. Once the ticks attach to an animal or human they remain in place feeding for up to 3 days, they only fall off once they are engorged. How to remove a tick? It is important to make sure the mouth part of the tick is removed along with the body. You should never try to pull, squeeze or burn the tick to remove it. Specially designed tick removers are really effective.
