**Sizzlin' Summer Guidelines**

It's so nice to know you have a safe place like Trailriders to come too. To keep us all safe, sound and OPEN remember to follow the rules, and HAVE FUN!

**Masks**  
Masks are still required in common areas (ie around the office, the pump house, and while using a public portapotty)  
**Sign-In**  
You must still sign-in. A little unconventionally through emailing us at trailriders@rauschcreekracing.com please list your Member #, campsite address and how many members are with you.

**NO guests just YET.**  
**No Construction...absolutely no construction or site work without approval from the office.** Structures (like sheds and campers coming into the campground) must be approved through the office as well.  
**No Ropes or Metal Chains:** Don't risk injury to another member by placing a hard-to-see chain or rope anywhere at your campsite. The only exception is plastic chain, bright in color (they are easy to break).

**Dogs are welcome:** Please keep your dogs on a leash. Many members bring their pets and while they may not be aggressive, they can wander off and get lost. Your pet is then at risk of facing a wild animal or not being found.

**Quiet time is 10:00pm:**  
- Be considerate of fellow members, *quiet time* hours are from 10pm-7am. Turn down the volume of music and voices.

- If you have a LOUD generator, it needs to be turned off.  
Some basic safety guidelines while out on the trails are:  
\*Always carry a cell phone programmed with the RCTR Office phone number.  
\*Get lost or separated from your group? Stop and stay where you are; call the office for assistance if need be.  
\*Make sure your gas tanks are topped off before each ride.  
**Don't get fined:** The local township police patrol the Township Road on the weekends. An *emergency* is your only excuse to be on Township road.  
Most members say that as soon as they hit the dirt road all their worries go away! Keep the above guidelines in mind and you'll keep those worries away.

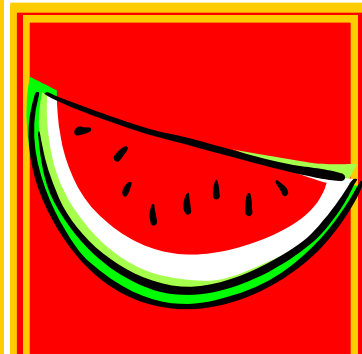
