The sun is shining the snow is all but gone. **It's a joyous thing.**

Spring, Spring, Springgg! Sing it with me...Every Spring we move our clocks one hour ahead and "lose" an hour during the night. But Daylight Saving Time (and not Daylight Savings Time with an "s") wasn't just created to confuse our schedules.

The phrase "Spring forward" helps people remember how Daylight Saving Time affects their clocks. At 2 a.m. on the second Sun. in March, we set our clocks forward one hour ahead of Standard Time ("Spring forward").

The change to Daylight Saving Time allows us to use less energy in lighting our homes by taking advantage of the longer and later daylight hours.

Daylight Saving Time was instituted in the United States during World War I in order to save energy for war production by taking advantage of the later hours of daylight between April and October. During World War II the federal government again required the states to observe the time change. Between the wars and after World War II, states and communities chose whether or not to observe Daylight Saving Time. In 1966, Congress passed the Uniform Time Act, which standardized the length of Daylight Saving Time.

Whether "Spring forward" or "Fall back," we change our clocks one hour ahead or behind twice each year, thanks to Daylight Saving Time. **Don't Forget to Change those Clocks!!!**
