Time for a Trim

Our guys did some trimming in early spring but the "Face-slappers" are growing back again, it's that time of year. Face-slappers are the tree branches that have grown and are hanging into the trails and slap you in the face as you ride by. Some of them can almost knock you off your machine! Bring your pruning shears, tree loppers or whatever tool you have and strap it to your ATV or bike. When you come across a face-slapper, slap it back! Be sure to cut all branches back flush with a main branch or to the trunk and remove all debris from the trail.

You'll notice a big difference the next time you go down that trail and you'll know that YOU made a difference!
