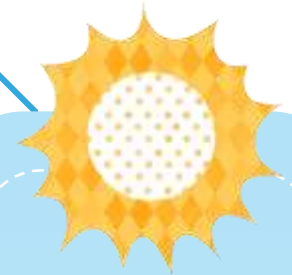

IT'S HOT, HOT, HOT

With the hot and dry days of Summer we've been having, here are some tips to keep everyone comfortable.

Drink, Drink, Drink - Fill your camelback with water or any other drink that will keep you hydrated. Even if you don't feel thirsty, stop and take a drink. Dehydration comes on you quickly and can cause serious health problems. If you don't have a camelback, find some way to carry a drink with you.

Slow Down - The camp road speed limit is 5 mph. If you see a dust cloud behind you, that means slow down! On the Trails - Be aware that your dust cloud on the trails can cause oncoming riders or riders that you are passing to have difficulty seeing. Be courteous and slow down to say hi.

Go For A Swim - Cool off after a ride at one of the local swimming holes. Swimmers are welcome, but soaps, glass

and trash are not. Or check out the local pool! The Tri-Valley Community Pool is open Monday-Sunday 1pm-8pm.

Watch those Children! - Many children come to RCTR to ride with their parents and enjoy the riding/camping experience. Be sure to keep a look-out for any smaller riders.

Campfires - Keep your campfires small and under control so you don't risk catching the campground on fire. Keep a fire extinguisher or water close by so any stray embers can be put out immediately. NEVER leave a campfire unattended. Pour water over the coals and stir them around so everything is extinguished.

Quiet Time - Quiet time in the campground is 10PM to 7AM. Now that's not just for riding, it's also for generators, loud music and hootin' and hollerin'.



Is your Helmet strapped?

Are you roaming the campground roads or even the trails without your helmet strapped? Be safe & please always make sure yours is!
